**CONCEPT NOTE**

The panel is aimed at addressing the question whether the term “feminism” in the singular is still relevant and moves from the assumption that it should be declined in the plural, so as to reflect its diverse and polycentric nature.

Yet, a minimal definition of “feminism” could be as acritical perspective that takes gender as a point of reference to unveil forms of domination and identify emancipatory practices. The matter at stake is whether feminism(s) still constitutes a form of critique.
